Message From the West

Brethren.

I wanted to find some bit of Masonic history that occurred in the month of April. As I was $\frac{1}{2} \left(\frac{1}{2} \right) = \frac{1}{2} \left(\frac{1}{2} \right) \left($

researching the topic I came across something not Masonic per se, but something that American Freemasons did that helped transform our world in the 20th century and beyond.

Per themasonictrowel.com:

US President and Bro. Harry S Truman signed the Plan for European Recovery into law. The Plan - dubbed The Marshall Plan - was suggested by then Secretary of State Bro. George C. Marshall in a speech at Harvard University June 5, 1947. When the Second World War ended in 1945, most European countries were in desperate circumstances. Cities and industries were destroyed, economies were in tatters, and hunger was a serious threat. Even where the social structure was intact, the formidable task of rebuilding was hampered by the lack of capital. The situation threatened to cripple U.S.-European trade and to benefit the large communist parties active in several key European countries. To address this crisis, [Brother] Marshall gave the speech at Harvard in which he proposed that European nations create a plan to reconstruct their economies and that the United States provide economic help to accomplish the plan. Marshall explained that the goal was not just to end "poverty, desperation and chaos" but also to "permit the emergence of political and social conditions in which free institutions can exist." ... Popularly known as the Marshall Plan, officially it was titled The Economic Cooperation Act of 1948, it was overwhelmingly approved by Congress, and was signed into law by President Truman on this date. Since 90% of the money went to grants given to European countries to buy primarily U.S. goods and services, it also brought immediate benefits to the American economy. From the American point of view, the Marshall Plan provided markets for American goods, created reliable trading partners, and supported the development of stable, non-Communist, democratic governments in Western Europe. From the European point of view, it restored agricultural and industrial productivity, pre vented political chaos and famine, and built a solid foundation for a post-war economic boom. It also earned Bro. Marshall a Nobel Peace Prize in 1953.

I knew that Brother Truman signed the Marshall Plan into law, and I knew that this legislation helped rebuild Europe, and rehabilitate Germany and Italy, but I did not know that THE George C. Marshall was a Freemason! Fun fact: Brother Marshall was raised "at sight" by the Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of District of Columbia in 1941. It is truly amazing to read about how our brothers, no doubt influenced by our principles, have produced works that have without

exaggeration transformed the lives of so many in such a positive way.

Masonic Education:

Freemasonry, Building More Bridges And Less Walls

Years ago, I worked with some other Master Masons to create a Masonic Builders Group within the Freemasonry. We were going to start a local group, branch out to the whole state and then take the idea nationwide. The group was based upon Joseph Fort Newton's Masonic Builders idea. This was an excellent plan, that had all the right people in place but for many reasons, never took off. As Brother Fort Newton said;

"Men build too many walls and not enough bridges."

"Time is a river...and books are boats. Many volumes start down that stream, only to be wrecked and lost beyond recall in its sands. Only a few, a very few, endure the testings of time and live to bless the ages following." \sim Joseph Fort Newton

The Builders is one of the most important Masonic books ever written and every Master Mason should read it. It explains the allegorical nature of what it means to be a Master Mason and a good decent human being. Even though, this book was written in 1914 it still holds true today, maybe even more than ever. When Masons say' "We take a good man and make him better" what we are talking about, is what Brother Fort Newton describes in this book.

"Man was not meant to be a cringing being, eaten up by anxiety, shut up a prisoner in silent loneliness, living in blind cruelty. He was meant for great adventures if he has the insight to see the laws of life and the key of kindness to unlock the doors; and in his quest for the best in others, he will discover something in himself not guessed before. For each of us, though we may not be clever or commanding, but only average and unknown, life can be winged and wonderful, full of meaning and music, if we have the faith to trust the God who made us, and the wisdom to live, love, and learn." I wish more people who harshly judge Freemasonry would read this book.

Brother Fort Newton believes that every man should be educated and has the right to a good education.

The idea for the Masonic Builders group was to create an online Masonic College of Classical Liberal Arts, Philosophy, Grammar, Logic, Rhetoric, Geometry, Music, & Cosmology. We had Brothers with exceptional teaching skills that volunteered to create and teach online classes. I was going to be the webmaster. Hopefully, one day, in Masonry, we will stop building walls and start building more bridges. There is much hope with younger Master Masons. I have taken Rumi and Tolstoy advice.
